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What Is Adderall XR 15 mg?

Adderall XR 15 mg is an extended-release prescription medication used to treat Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) in adults and children aged 6 years and older. It contains a combination of amphetamine and dextroamphetamine, two central nervous system (CNS) stimulants that improve focus, attention, and impulse control.

 - The other dissolves slowly to maintain benefits over the day.
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Approved Medical Uses

Adderall XR 15 mg is primarily prescribed for:

- Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Narcolepsy (less commonly, under medical supervision)

It is not recommended for simple fatigue or to enhance academic or athletic performance.

Dosage and Administration

- Starting dose for adults: 10 mg once daily in the morning.
- Typical maintenance range: 10 mg–30 mg daily depending on response.
- Adderall XR 15 mg may be prescribed when lower doses are insufficient.

How to take it:

- Take once daily in the morning with or without food.

Most users tolerate Adderall XR well, but side effects may occur, especially when starting treatment or adjusting dosage.

Common side effects include:

- Loss of appetite or weight loss
- Dry mouth
- Insomnia or trouble sleeping
- Headache
- Stomach upset or nausea
- Anxiety or restlessness

Serious side effects (seek medical attention):

- Chest pain or irregular heartbeat
 - Shortness of breath
 - Hallucinations or paranoia
 - Severe mood changes
 - Signs of circulation problems (numbness or discoloration of fingers/toes)
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Warnings and Precautions

- **Heart Risks:** Stimulants may increase blood pressure and heart rate. People with heart disease, high blood pressure, or a history of stroke should consult their doctor.
- **Mental Health:** May exacerbate anxiety, bipolar disorder, or psychosis.
- **Substance Use Risk:** Adderall XR can be habit-forming if misused.
- **Pregnancy and Breastfeeding:** Use only if benefits outweigh potential risks.
- **Drug Interactions:** Avoid combining with MAO inhibitors, acidifying agents (vitamin C), or other stimulants.

Always disclose your full medical history and all medications to your prescriber.

 - Dispose of unused capsules through a DEA take-back program.
