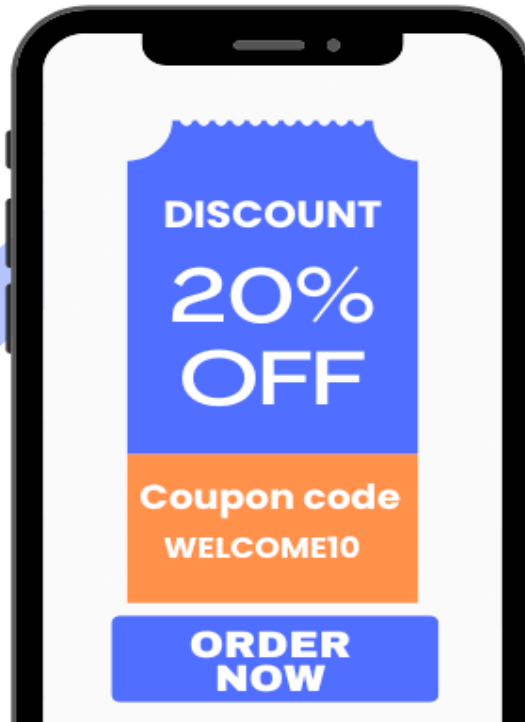

Ativan (Lorazepam): Uses, Effects, Safety & Treatment Overview

What Is Ativan and Why Do Doctors Prescribe It?

Ativan is a prescription medication that contains Lorazepam, a benzodiazepine used for short-term management of anxiety and related conditions.
